

Dance Cottage was the first house to be built in Ravensthorpe in 1900, after gold was discovered and the Phillips River gold-rush ensued. A miner, George Dance, built the cottage for his wife and family, in the main street of the town and it remains, faithfully restored, as a key attraction in the Ravensthorpe Museum. It is furnished with period items and set as though the Dance family were still living there.
